MARRIAGE OF MOSZEK BARON AND KAYLA ZELDA ROSENBERG IN 1872, RADOSZYCE, POLAND

Translation from Russian

It took place in the trade post of Radoszyce on April 2nd, 1872 at 2 pm. Witnesses: Haskiel Klapper age 68, and Alter Litman, 47, both scholars residing in Radoszyce, came in person and informed us that last night at 7 pm, in their presence, Moszek Baran, a bachelor age 20, a son of Rubin Baron and Cipor nee Gothoht, a legal couple residing in Radoszyce, married Kayla Zelda Rosenberg, a virgin of 20, a daughter of deceased Moszek Rosenberg (illegible mother's first name, illegible maiden name and the residence of the Rozenbergs, also illegible description of the ceremony).

The newlywed announced that they did not sign any marital agreement. The religious marriage ceremony took place in (name of the place illegible) and it was conducted by a Rabbi of the Radoszyce region.

This certificate is given to the witnesses and signed in Yiddish by: Moshek Baron, (first name illegible) Rinkler, Kayla Zelda Rozenberg, Haskiel Klapper, and Alter Litman.
